Order of Draw:

The order of tube collection, when drawing either glass or plastic tubes, is formatted to avoid possible test result error due to cross contamination from tube additives.

vacutainer and syringe collection of evacuated tubes

NOTE: When dispensing blood from a syringe draw, all tubes must be in an upright position. The additives are generally at the bottom of the tube. Don't invert the tube until the needle is extracted.

Tube/Additive

Royal Blue (Plain) Blue (sodium citrate) Red SST/Red gel/Gold Green (heparin) Green gel Lavender (EDTA) Pink Tan Gray Yellow

For all special coag testing (tests other than PT and aPTT), a discard tube is required. This discard tube must be a citrate tube.

winged infusion set

When utilizing a winged infusion set for collection of a coagulation tube, a nonadditive or a coagulation discard tube should be drawn first. The discard tube serves to fill the dead space in the collection tubing and assure the proper ration of anticoagulant to blood.

skin puncture

When performing specimen collection through a skin puncture, the lavender EDTA tube should be collected prior to the serum tubes to help prevent clots in the EDTA tube.
